The Brook and Liberty trails up Chocorua are renowned for their rugged beauty and natural life including moose and bear down to toads and salamanders. Parts of the area were logged many years ago, but the regenerated forest and remaining virgin stands are magnificent. Generations of families from across the USA and internationally are familiar with Mt Chocorua and the range over to Whiteface. The road up to Ferncroft and the view of the Sandwich Range should be left undisturbed for future generations. Disturbing the forests and creating highly visible blights that will not heal for 50-100 years is unconscionable. Those mountains were venerated by the native Americans which lived and hunted on those slopes, and the same attitude is shared by the people living there today.
