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Comments: This appears to be an excellent way to destroy heavily used trail systems. 1000' is a very long setback, way more than needed for simply wildfire protection, it will destroy the wonderful shaded trails, the creeks along the trails will be dried up and/or polluted with mud runoff, destroy the wildflower, huckleberry and game habitat, the firewood gathering at the Goose Creek trailhead. These trails are very heavily used by hikers, bikers, horse riders, hunters, sightseers. Please reconsider your approach to this plan; it is huge. Rethink this and cut it way back to existing roads to protect homes and do not approach this with private logger mentality. You have destroyed the Mt Ellis trail systems. The travel from logging trucks will negatively effect the homes along Goose Creek; maybe you would prefer to be bought out by wealthy landowner like the forest plans above Eagle Rock? What happened to the desperate need to prevent wildfires there? Is destruction of forest habitat for wildlife your goal?
