You reference a 2002 document ([https://www.fs.usda.gov/Internet/FSE\\_DOCUMENTS/stelprdb5401590.pdf](https://www.fs.usda.gov/Internet/FSE_DOCUMENTS/stelprdb5401590.pdf)) that whitewashes the negative aspects of grazing on high parts of the Mesa that people use to recreate, and wild animals need to be healthy.
