Is 1,000 feet too much? Is 1000 feet going to be enough? Tough questions. I live near high voltage lines and the distance is only 100 feet. When it encompasses my yard and what I can plant, that's too much, but woods are right next door and 100 feet doesn't look like enough.

I've seen wildfires started around high voltage lines in California via the news and the fire breaks didn't appear to be wide enough.

Is this 1000 feet in addition to the trails/lanes/roads or does it include the width of said roads?

Besides fires...what type of environmental harm will occur during the making of these breaks?

I know that fire breaks are necessary to prevent the spread. I also know that with certain weather...and fire...conditions, increase the speed, direction and the fire's ability to jump great distances.
