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Comments: I understand that these burnings make fighting future fires easier, so normally the intermittent smoky skies are tolerable. However, the Quarry Fire has impacted those in my family with respiratory difficulties (those who work, and cannot avoid going outside). Those I know without such difficulties, including myself, are aghast at just how bad the air smells at any one point during the day. All the articles about letting the fire continue spreading in order to meet goals now feel more infuriating than comforting. During cooler weather, we've previously opened our windows in lieu of ceiling fans/the AC unit. However, we must run these in lieu of letting cooler air in, because it's so smoky. It's enough that people will often start burning fires in their fireplaces/woodstoves before it's cold enough to warrant starting fires, but without the burning going on outside, it's so much worse. I wish that a fire that's been burning for nearly two months now, could just be put out, in order to alleviate the poor air quality.
