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Comments: As someone who climbs, I fully support the above measures to better regulate and monitor the impact of climbing on natural areas. Climbers are one of the more impactful outdoor use groups in our wild areas. The development of crags usually requires permanent alterations of cliff faces, as well as the permanent installations of anchors and bolts, along with the displacement of nesting bird populations and sometimes the destruction of prehistoric sites. Climbing by nature is not LNT and due to its recent increases in users it tends to attract droves of people with less knowledge of LNT principles and wilderness ethics. It only makes sense that such a popular and sometimes destructive use group be monitored and regulated in the same manner other use groups are. I do not advocate for blanket bans on climbing, however, our wild areas are being loved to death and all use groups to include climbers, should be subject to thoughtful, science based management to curtail environmental degradation and harmful impact.
