Comments: The Forest Service plan to burn designated Wilderness areas in the Sequoia and Sierra National Forests to comply with the Wilderness Act is wrong and should not be implemented. Areas including the Ansel Adams, Dinkey Lakes, John Muir, Kaiser, Kiavah, Monarch, South Sierra, Dome Land, Jennie Lakes, and Golden Trout Wildernesses should instead be left alone to adapt to changing climate conditions rather than be artificially managed with uncertain results.
