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Comments: Who better to install, review, and replace fixed anchor bolts for climbing than those who's lives depend on them? Those with the knowledge and experience to do so, who can do it at the moment old anchors are deemed unsafe? These proposed changes to classify anchors as "installations" introduce red tape, which means it'll take time to service those anchors.

The climbing community has long been responsible for these anchors and, in the past few decades, has been more responsible for keeping the wilderness accessible yet pristine: we care about nature because we want to enjoy it and preserve it for future generations of climbers to enjoy. Ours and their safety are paramount.

Things in this regard have been fine as they are. This change is not only unnecessary but detrimental to replacing old, worn anchors as soon as there is doubt about their safety.
