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Comments: Fixed anchors are an essential piece of climbers safety systems and are not classified as "prohibited installations" under the wilderness act, and should not be amended to be made as such. It is completely unreasonable for federal agencies to create new policies prohibiting fixed anchors when they have allowed, managed and given authority to said anchors for several decades.
