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Comments: I'm writing to oppose a ban of fixed anchors in wilderness areas.

Ultimately, the strategic use of fixed anchors in wilderness climbing ensures a delicate balance between the pursuit of adventure and the responsibility of environmental stewardship, allowing climbers to enjoy the beauty of untamed landscapes while safeguarding their future accessibility.
