Comments: I'm very excited this conversation was started. It was high time! As an avid 2nd Amendment supporter and firearms enthusiast I am passionate about gun safety.

I would love to see your plans for proposed ranges and locations.

If I may offer some suggestions:

- common starting line
- 7 (10 lanes), 25 (5), 50 (2), 100 (2), 200 (2), shotgun area, yard firing lanes with berms in between different range lengths, so the firing lane may be moved forward and safety preserved.
- no furniture, shooters can provide shooting benches, throwers, awnings, etc.
- no target stands
- informational posts on how to easily make target holders
- heavy emphasize on the rules of gun safety (NRA's 3 rules), or the older 4 rules of gun safety
- signage about a Red Cross Stop the Bleed class and that a tourniquet and safety plan is recommended.
- comb the backstops for rocks and other hard objects which might create ricochets.
- a yearly challenge of accuracy in various classes, maybe even a yearly bowling pin shoot with the Sheriff's, like Bandimere did with street racers and CHP.
- Maybe host Revere's Riders, Project Appleseed and the Liberal Gun Club events to increase buy-in to protect public spaces from various members of the public.

This should result in the greatest up front cost in scraping the ranges, but decrease the running cost to near nil for year-to-year expenditures, offer irresponsible shooters the least number of impromptu targets or areas of vandalism and build some great camaraderie between law enforcement and shooters.
