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Comments: I believe that restricting the establishment of new routes to "existing climbing opportunities" on non-Wilderness lands is unenforceable and will create confusion amongst land managers and climbers. Non-Wilderness climbing management policy should maintain opportunities for new anchors unless and until analyses determine climbing should be restricted to protect cultural and natural resources. We do need to protect our history and historical sites, but having new routes limited blankly to only existing climbing opportunities will only make the taboo hidden and possibly hurt more. People need to be taught and entrusted with respecting nature and history. Blanket restrictions won't help that.
