I'd venture to say that 99% of these anchors would only ever be seen (and appreciated) by other climbers-no one else enjoying the Wilderness or Forest Service area would ever even be aware of their presence. Please ensure that the safe use of fixed anchors in Forest Service and Wilderness areas remains available to and inclusive of the climbing community. Restricting the establishment of new routes to "existing climbing opportunities" on non-wilderness lands is unenforceable and will only cause confusion amongst land managers and climbers.
