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Comments: Fixed anchors are essential for climbing safety. They are not prohibited installations under the Wilderness Act. Anchors preserve the natural state of the wilderness and allow sustainable access for generations to come.

America has a rich climbing legacy that would essentially be erased. Climbing management policy needs to protect existing routes and its history not remove them.

Restricting the establishment of new routes to "existing climbing opportunities" on non-Wilderness lands is unenforceable and will create confusion amongst land managers and climbers. Non-Wilderness climbing management policy should maintain opportunities for new anchors unless and until analyses determine climbing should be restricted to protect cultural and natural resources.
