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Comments: Please reconsider policy changes affecting bolting and bolted anchors in wilderness areas. While the wilderness act does prohibit altering the landscape in designated areas, exceptions have always been made for small low impact modifications such as trail signs, trail crossing bridges, walking trails that increase accessibility and safety to wilderness areas with minimal defacement of the land. I cannot think of a more minor modification to an area than a climbing bolt, being only 2 inches across, an untrained eye would almost never spot one. Even climbers who are actively looking for them often have a difficult time locating them. Meanwhile, they allow SAFE climbing and particularly lowering from cliffs. Without access to rappel anchors for climbers to descend from, many popular climbs would only have dangerous walk offs or scrambles to return to the ground level. Again please reconsider the policy changes, if these changes were to go into affect many of America's most famous and storied climbs could become inaccessible to climbers who dream of completing them.
