I am writing in regards to the proposed changes to Wilderness areas that will greatly affect the sport of climbing.

First and foremost, fixed anchors (and being able to maintain, replace, and update hardware) is extremely important for the safety of already established routes. Without the upkeep and necessary maintenance, there will be safety issues that will eventually lead to equipment failures, accidents, and possible injury/death. It is unreasonable for government agencies to now redact and create new policies prohibiting Wilderness climbing anchors when they have been managed and allowed in the past.

There is a significant benefit to the recreational aspect of the economy that will be impacted as well. People who travel to climb and recreate stimulate the local economy and bring in money. This is directly taken and quoted from the Choose Colorado Office of Economic Development and International Trade website:

"In fact, recent statistics show that 92% of Colorado residents participate in outdoor recreation each year.
