Please work with Tribes as much as possible in these restoration efforts to promote Indigenous Ecological Knowledge and culturally relevant resources within the NWFP area.

Also work with Tribes and communities to build restoration workforce capacity in the regions most affected by the NWFP. After all, the indigenous communities were the original keepers of this nation and it is most appropriate that they have agency for what was originally their land.
