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Comments: Fixed anchors are an essential piece of climbers' safety system, without them climbers have to rely on natural features such as trees and rocks to create an anchor for repelling or belaying on multi-pitch, which can create major safety concerns, especially when there are more than one party climbing at a time. Having fixed anchors creates a traffic system up routes and climbers know exactly which points they will stop at and/or repel off of. All guide books written today are based off of this system and would need to be re-written, and let's face it, most climbers use copies that are decades old! Climbing collations have formed in most states to inspect and maintain fixed anchors, thus it does not impede or use resources of the federal government to maintain these systems. Additionally, it is unreasonable for federal agencies to create new guidance policies prohibiting Wilderness climbing anchors across the country when they have allowed, managed, and authorized fixed anchors for decades. Please keep climbing safely legal!
