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Comments: 1.Fixed anchors are not only an essential piece of a climber's safety system but have limited measurable impact on natural spaces per existing climbing policies.

- 2.It is unwarranted nor reasonable for federal agencies to create or enforce new guidance policies nationwide after decades of established, authorized, and managed use of fixed anchors.
- 3. Prohibiting fixed anchors lowers inclusivity and accessibility of wilderness areas for a more diverse range of climbers, and threatens not only America's legacy of climbing, but also its future.
- 4.Restricting the establishment of new routes to "existing climbing opportunities" of non-wilderness lands is unenforceable, confusing, and runs the risk of damage to rock in existing areas due to forced overuse.
