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Comments: Hello,

Restricting the establishment of new routes to "existing climbing opportunities" on non-Wilderness lands is unenforceable and will create confusion amongst land managers and climbers. Non-Wilderness climbing management policy should maintain opportunities for new anchors unless and until analyses determine climbing should be restricted to protect cultural and natural resources.

Bolts on routes need to be MAINTAINED and replaced on a regular basis in order to ensure they are safe. If routes need to be maintained regardless, it is nonsensical to ban future bolting. In the name of safety for climbers, the opportunity for new bolting should be maintained to protect people, and cultural and natural resources.
