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Comments: I have been rock climbing in national forest and national parks since 1994, and am writing to protest the attempts to overturn 60 years of legal interpretation, and conclude, for the first time ever, that climbing anchors are an installation that need to be governed by §4(c) of the Wilderness Act. This is unreasonable and irrational. Of all the uses of our national parks and forest service land, climbing is by far the lowest in impact. Climbing anchors such as bolts and pitons are difficult to see when you are on top of them. I have frequently climbed right past them. Frankly, there are many better uses of federal time and money than this.
