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Comments: I have been a climber for 10 years, climbing is an important part of the human experience and community. Climbing has taught me how to exist with nature and respecting the land. Prohibiting the use of bolts will only become a safety issue. Prohibiting bolts is only a regression after decades of climbing history and progression towards safety and accessibility. Access fund has said it perfectly as below. Restricting the establishment of new routes to "existing climbing opportunities" on non-Wilderness lands is unenforceable and will create confusion amongst land managers and climbers. Non-Wilderness climbing management policy should maintain opportunities for new anchors unless and until analyses determine climbing should be restricted to protect cultural and natural resources.
