Climbers who recreate in wilderness areas love these areas and want to keep them wild. We do not leave unnecessary gear and do what we can to keep anchors camouflaged so that they are hidden unless you are trying to find them. I am suggesting fixed anchors continue to be allowed in wilderness area but must be camouflaged as to not be noticed by those not climbing or using these anchors.
