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Comments: The idea of prohibiting fixed anchors and the replacement of existing bolts on climbing routes in wilderness areas not only limits access to wilderness areas, but it also creates an unsafe environment for everybody to explore these spaces. Bolts rust, and without proper inspection/replacement, serious injuries or deaths could occur. We need to create a new standard for these practices, rather than completely wiping them off the table. Climbers have the same rights to be outside as everybody else. As long as we practice Leave No Trace ethics from car to crag, I believe we should be allowed to continue to pursue the legacy that is outdoor rock climbing, including the ability to safely climb and lower off fixed anchors.
