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Comments: I found Climbing as a youth in Boy Scouts. Following that, I became AMGA certified so I could instruct and lead group climbs. A few years back I found my lost love for climbing. Since then, I have been more involved in the climbing community. I understand the impact that future laws could have on many place I have once adventured and climbed. Therefore I leave these as my final part of my comment.

Restricting the establishment of new routes to "existing climbing opportunities" on non-Wilderness lands is unenforceable and will create confusion amongst land managers and climbers. Non-Wilderness climbing management policy should maintain opportunities for new anchors unless and until analyses determine climbing should be restricted to protect cultural and natural resources
