In order to enjoy the outdoors in this way, extra purchasing of cams and other tools would be required, increasing the likelihood of injury, falls, and damage to the climbing routes as everyone then places anchors in different locations, damaging a wider area everywhere. Removing existing anchors would also damage these areas. Banning anchors is not a good idea.
