Climbing is a legitimate and appropriate use of wilderness designated land. Climbers as a user group are highly motivated to protect the environment which we share. This is evident in the vast number of climbing organizations across the country that are involved in trash clean ups, graffiti clean ups, trail maintenance, and low environmental impact education.

A small number of fixed bolts and anchors are necessary to allow for safe climbing, however the overall impact of these safety features is minimal. They are only placed when absolutely necessary. Climbers are historically excellent stewards of our public lands. We understand the necessity of minimizing environmental impact while still allowing people to experience the wonder of our public lands.
