Comments: The Forest Service has a responsibility is to preserve biophysical environments to be primarily free from human manipulation and impact as much as possible. Experiences should be in natural environments as free as possible from signs of modern society. The Bob Marshall Wilderness Complex was not set up to promote any particular usage like the commercial practices of outfitting and/or guiding. The Bob Marshall Wilderness Complex Outfitter and Guide Permit Reauthorization lacks any previously required site-specific information even though it requests site-specific comments. The Forest Service really ought to avail the following information for public review on its website. The Forest Service has to also extend public commenting period for forty five additional days after that information is published on the website:

Points that the Forest Service has to follow:

- 1.) The number of permitted service days versus actual use for each permit
- 2.) The number of annual inspections, performance evaluations, or public complaints related to each campsite or operator
- 3.) National Environmental Policy Act documents and decisions dealing with outfitting service allocation in the Bob Marshall Wilderness Complex
- 4.) Campsite Management Plans for each outfitter camp
- 5.) Given the impacts that guiding and outfitting has on the Bob Marshall Wilderness, it has to be that Forest Service does not use "Categorical Exclusions" to renew guide and outfitter permits.
- 6.) Environmental Impact Statements with accompanying public input is called for to properly protect the Bob Marshall Wilderness Complex.
