Comments: The proposal would amend 128 forest plans nationwide to protect remaining old-growth from industrial logging, prohibit actions that degrade old-growth forests, promote actions to improve climate change resilience and reduce the risk of uncharacteristic fire activity in fire-prone forests.

Because of intensive logging and development, old-growth forests today occur on less than 17 percent of America's national forests.

Now is the time to speak up! The Forest Service's proposal is a great start, but it must also provide direction for restoring old-growth forest distribution and abundance, including recruitment from mature forests. Mature forests provide many of the ecological roles as fully functional old-growth. Over time, mature forests will recover depleted areas. The proposal must also set clear benchmarks for the occurrence, arrangement, and connectivity of old-growth forest conditions across the landscape.
