However, I and many others are curious as to what "active management" of mature and old-growth ecosystems might look like, and would like to see more specific information in that section of the amendment. I'm also curious as to whether this management will involve tribal co-stewardship as is mentioned in many of the other sections.

Concerning climate change, it would be wonderful to see plans for flood mitigation that protect not only vulnerable communities, but which mitigate damage as much as possible to species that rely on the Mt. Hood waterways, especially keystone species like salmon and beavers.
