Comments: The land covered by ANILCA is federally protected wilderness land. It is not public land. The US forest service was generous in issuing special use permit for those unauthorized cabins. The intent was to phase out those cabins, because they were unauthorized and do not belong there. Cabins don't belong in designated Wilderness. The U.S. Forest Service must leave its policy unchanged and phase out ANILCA cabins, as was the original intent.
