Comments: Cabins don't belong in designated Wilderness. The U.S. Forest Service must leave its policy unchanged and phase out ANILCA cabins, as was the original intent. These cabins were never meant to persist in Wilderness, and to change this policy would undermine ANILCA and the Wilderness Act. My family formerly had a lease on a similar cabin years ago within Lassen Volcanic National Park. It was build prior to the creation of that national park.
