Comments: In 1987 the U.S Forest Service created a program that issued special-use permits for these unauthorized cabins, renewable and nontransferable, terminating upon the death of the last immediate family member of the original claimant.

THAT SHOULD NOT BE RESCINDED. The intent was to phase out these cabins, nowhere more important than in Wilderness, which is managed for its WILDNESS. To say that there are private uses for these cabins that are compatible with a WILDERNESS is just not true. Phasing out cabins in this manner is not unusual, and should be continued. Cabins don't belong in designated Wilderness.

The U.S. Forest Service must leave its policy unchanged and phase out ANILCA cabins, as was the original intent. These cabins were never meant to persist in Wilderness, and to change this policy would undermine ANILCA and the Wilderness Act.
