Comments: It has come to my attention that a rule for existing cabins within Alaska Wilderness areas was made in the 1980's that would allow current permit/cabin owners the right to give their leases to their children, until there would be no more left and the cabin would become defunct and de-authorized. This was fine as a compromise to owners when the Wilderness system was fully set up, as a deference to them. But the intent of this law was to phase out these structures which are normally not allowed in other Wilderness areas in the United States, thus bringing Alaska into line with the rest of the Nation. This proposed rule change would irrevocably and completely alter the drive to get rid of the cabins, and this start us down the slippery slope towards complete annihilating of Wilderness edicts.
