Comments: The Alaska National Interest Lands Conservation Act (ANILCA) was passed to preserve and protect nationally significant public land in Alaska for present and future generations. Directed by ANILCA, in 1987 the U.S Forest Service created a program that issued special-use permits for unauthorized cabins that had been constructed on federal lands, inside and outside areas ANILCA subsequently designated as Wilderness. The intent was to phase out these cabins because cabins don't belong in designated Wilderness. The U.S. Forest Service must leave its policy unchanged and phase out ANILCA cabins, as was the original intent. No restrictions should be removed from these permits. To change this policy would undermine ANILCA and the Wilderness Act. Please keep this Wilderness as wild as possible!
