I just read Section 1303 of the ANILCA in regards to cabins and improved structures. It looks pretty reasonable in the 1980 legalese, so there is no reason to adopt new wording. Just wait until the last family member who lived in the cabin departs the earth or at least the cabin, then follow through on closing such cabins rather than allowing various folks to declare emergencies such that they can access those cabins.
