Comments: Thank you for the opportunity to comment.

In general, cabins don't belong in designated Wilderness. The documents I could find do not describe "traditional and customary services." I am opposed to ending the current U.S. Forest Service policy that phases out ANILCA cabin. Wilderness does not persist in the pure form if humans have permanent structures.

I could envision an acceptable exemption policy if it is narrowly and specifically defined and meets an unmet need. For example, if native people who have been displaced would inhabit cabins temporarily to carry out traditional celebrations, it might be worth making an exemption. But this exemption policy should be presented for public comment.
