Comments: Cabins don't belong in designated Wilderness. The U.S. Forest Service must leave its the original policy unchanged and phase out ANILCA cabins, as was the primary intent. These cabins were never meant to persist in the Wilderness. There is not supposed to be a permanent presence on these lands and changing this policy would undermine ANILCA and the Wilderness Act.

To Try to use this lapse in justice, this loophole in timelines to ignore the court's original intent to preserve these lands in their wild state, and conserve the wildlife in one of the undisturbed places is dishonest in the extreme.
