The Arizona Trail has touched so many lives - my family is just one small example. Over the years, my family and I have hiked on many parts of the Trail. My mother and I were both born in Arizona; she grew up experiencing its history from the building of Hoover Dam, where her father worked, to childhood in Phoenix and Tucson, to later teaching and raising our family in the Flagstaff area; then in retirement she led a hiking group in Mesa. Many of the hikes she made and I shared with her were on the Trail; especially Passages such as 17-23, 31-33, 37-38. Favorite sites included Picketpost, the Superstition Wilderness, Walnut Canyon, and of course the Grand Canyon.
