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Comments: Based on the meeting on 4/24, I'm adding additional comment. The forest service has the obligation to coordinate with all public safety agencies within the boundaries of the area being reviewed. The statements of fixing the highway belongs to the state highway department as an example is not acceptable. If the Forrest service plans to take action from clearing fuel to prescribed burns the own ensuing that all local, State, and federal agencies are engaged and part of establishing and solving infrastructure challenges to ensure the plan as well as its contingency are in place to ensure success or limit risk. The Las Hurtado Canyon and bordering national forest has been neglected for years and addressing the current risk requires all to be engaged as well as the local communities. The Forrest service would be irresponsible to move forward without their actions being contingent on a comprehensive plan and clear accountabilities being address.

Additionally, while the Forrest service works through their process, they should advise the community along with CC avenues for support and funding to remove fuel from private land. The Forrest service created a sense of urgency without a plan for immediate action. Give the community the tools, knowledge and support to do something and that starts on private property.
