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Comments: Having been evacuated during the Colorado North Fork Fire ?? due to a controlled burn that became uncontrolled due to high winds, I am disturbed that a prescribed burn in our area could also get out of control. Gusty and high winds are not uncommon in the area you are targeting. Sudden changes in weather are also common. Steep terrain would also make it difficult to maintain control. And finally, embers from a forest fire can ignite several days after a fire has swept thru, which was the case in the Calf Creek Fire. The Mora Fire, which was an uncontrolled prescribed burn, burnt 341,000 acres. A fluke in the winds and glowing embers can result in devastating consequences. It can also result in loss of life, as it did in the North Fork Fire, with the first civilian casualties on record at the time in Colorado. I just need some assurance that an out of control prescribed burn in las Huertas Canyon and north Sandia mountains will not happen. Quite frankly, given Mother Natures unpredictability, I don't feel the Forest Service can make that guarantee.
