Then you are saying you will use herbicides to kill the invasive species, which will no doubt get in the water supply. The herbicides will get in the ponds. There are 100's of ponds fed by those mountains you are planning to clearcut.

There will be serious siltation of our streams and we have the Cumberland Darter, an endangered fish found no where else in the world but here in Whitley County and in the Jellico Mountains. There is no way your clearcut plan is going to help that fish, that we all can agree!

I have lived here for 30 years and travelled the world. There is almost no prettier place on the planet than right here. Don't disturb out tranquil natural beauty.

I ask you to do not harvest on steep slopes. I am completely opposed to the Proposed Action. How would like to have your Proposed Action in your back yard? If you must log, go with Alternative 1 and be careful and caring to us and our people owned national forest.
