My wife and I love hiking in the region, and we take several long trips each year to hike in different parts of the nation. We actually look for areas and plan most of our trips based upon the hiking opportunities - Grand Junction, Durango, Breckenridge, Steamboat, Estes Park, Moab, Zion, Salt Lake City, western North Carolina, Tennessee, Ashville, just to name a few. We have hiked the Rich Mountain Trail and Earth Quake Ridge Trail numerous times. I also consider myself skewed to the left on the environment concerns in that I have a strong desire to protect it and minimize climate change because we love the outdoors so much. I say all of this to give you a perspective in who is making comments for the proposed development.

I took the time to read the environmental assessment and I appreciate the time and effort it takes in preparing one, however, it is a good resource for the community to review and to take into consideration in its support.
