Comments: I am writing to express my concern about the proposed changes to the Northwest Forest Plan. The original NWFP protected tree stands that were 80 years or older, it would be a huge impact to the old growth forests if that was increased to 120 years year old trees. That would open up 15% more mature forest for logging. This is not smart science in an age of global warming.

Salvage logging in old-growth forests after they've been disturbed by fire is also a poor idea. This would not allow for natural forest recovery following a fire.
