Why has due diligence not been done. What community outreach, planning or forecasting has been completed? I can't imagine you thought that there wouldn't be pushback?

There are so many elements that need to be considered - this isn't a cookie cutter approach - there are nuances to creating an infrastructure such as a state park and so many factors that seem to have been overlooked.

We owe it to our community and to our state to re-consider the current approach. Step back, think through this and really assess if this is the RIGHT thing to do? Can you in good conscious feel good about going against what the community is telling you they DON'T want? Have you truly assessed all of the objections the community has laid out (that should have been addressed way in advance of this designation in the first place)?

If this were your home - would you want this? Map out the pros / cons and tell us that you would support this for your community when you hear all of the detailed nuances to all of the key factors that will be impacted by this state park.

We hope that you will address ALL of the incredible letters that this community has written and understand the true eco-system that makes up Sweetwater Lake and what is really right for this area and what is right for the future of this land and it's people.
