Comments: This decision is a landmark decision for the United States and at it's core it is essentially a yes or no referendum on whether or not we should stop logging old growth trees. The fact that logging on National Forests only contributes approximately 5% of the board footage used for timber in the United States, and of that, a small fraction is currently coming from actual old growth trees, makes any discussion about balancing domestic lumber needs with conservation, a moot point.
