Specifically, I strongly encourage the following priorities in review of the plan:

- 1. NOGA should be amended to include passive management as an option for managing old-growth forests.
- 2. NOGA should include a non-degradation clause for cases where proactive stewardship methods are employed.
- 3. The Forest Service should remove the exception that allows for development at an "ecologically appropriate scale" and employ clear, already defined language to improve NOGA's clarity.
- 4. NOGA should be amended to include a clear plan for recruitment of mature forests into old-growth conditions.
- 5. NOGA should better characterize threats and more specifically prescribe management actions based on forest type and location.
