Comments: 1. Eastern old growth forests need to be managed separately from those in the West. They have a different relationship to human disturbance and fire, among other things.

- 2. Mature forests must be allowed to become old growth forests. President Biden's executive order 14072 directs that. Mature and old growth stands need to be managed differently from younger stands because of, and to invest in their greater ecological value and effectiveness as infrastructure to combat climate change.
