Comments: I support the permanent withdrawal of mining at the headlands of the Rapid Creek Watershed. The introduction of mining activities on any land is intrusive and produces toxic outcomes in the construction, transportation and extraction of mined minerals. This targeted harm to the greater earth and climate must be weighed against the narrow benefits to a few individuals.

I live in Northern California where matters of water and land are vital to the continuing existence of communities. Clean water is vital to humans, animals, plants and fisheries, often which suffer harm due to toxic human activities that may appear geographically distant. Toxic activities can no longer be deemed isolated in the context of climate change. Amazon deforestation affects carbon dioxide mitigation far removed from the Amazon.
