Midas Gold does not own this land. This is public land and they have no right to destroy yet another fishery for the pursuit of money. Life is far more precious than money, and much life would cease to exist if this mine is put in. It used to be that 40 percent of the salmon that ran up the Salmon River came up the South Fork. With the incorporations of dams this number has severely suffered and there is no reason to continue that suffering. The entire environment will change drastically without the salmon running up this river and the entire drainage will lose its character and much of the life that the salmon bring along with them.
